[Jesus says,] "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings and you were not willing."

-Luke 13:34

While dating Beth I would sometimes go to her church to worship with her. She had a priest that would say every once in a while, "It's interesting what the Bible doesn't say."

In this part of scripture Jesus has been around long enough and got a big enough following that Herod, the Roman governor, is already looking to take him out. Jesus also knows how it's going to go down. At some point he's going to go to Jerusalem and those in power are going to turn the people against him so that he will be executed.

I find it interesting what Jesus does *not* say in knowing that the people of Jerusalem are going to turn on him. He does not say, "Jerusalem, how I have desired to protect you and care for you like a wolf protects his pack from danger." I find it interesting because God is labelled the Father and the male gray wolf, if you did not know, is one of the most caring and loving father figures in nature. It hunts, provides, and protects his pack from danger.

Instead, Jesus refers to himself as a hen; as a mother chicken. He even says this in a male dominated society that glorified male warriors. I assume he says this because, while men are stereotypically physically stronger, mothers have a strength fueled by love that enables them to endure suffering beyond what fathers traditionally will endure.

Sometimes, for a variety of reasons, kids may stray from the way they were raised. Sometimes they find bad friends who lead them into all kinds of trouble from addiction, to theft, to crime in general. Both parents are going to break their backs trying to rescue their children from such destructive lifestyles in every way they know how, but, stereotypically, fathers will be the first to let their child go once that child has gone too far down that destructive road whereas, stereotypically, a mother's love will push them to endure much more pain and suffering from their child in the hopes of rescuing them.

Jesus knows that the people he has created as God (his children) will go so far down the road of destruction that they will kill their own father in one of the most brutal and humiliating ways possible. But because God is also a mother (Genesis 1:27 says females were created in the image of God) he has a love that can endure and forgive even when his own children put him to death.


Jesus tells us in the Luke reading above that even when his children become rebellious to the point of murdering their parent, even then, Jesus has the love of a mother that will never end; that will constantly endure pain from their children in the hopes of rescuing them from harm.

Traditionally men have had the glorious parts of parenting. They earn the money, pay the bills, build and buy things needed for the family, all really great things. But mothers are traditionally the ones whose love propels them further as they endure sleepless nights, cleaning puke and poop, cooking while going hungry, cleaning, carting kids around, teaching, raising, showing up, all things that go unnoticed as mothers go beyond the extra mile.

Jesus knew exactly what he was saying when he called himself a mother hen. God bless you moms and happy late Mothers' Day, especially those of you who go unnoticed and endure so silently. God is using you to make the world a better place.
