# **Pastor's Message**

But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

-Ephesians 2:4-7

We learn to say "It's not fair" early on in life. And that statement is true. Around fifteen I realized it was true for me in the opposite way, in that I fully realized how much God goes over the top to continually bless me when I don't deserve it while so many others need God's help more than me.

Ephesians says God shows us immeasurable riches and kindness; that has been my experience my whole life. Compared to the majority of the world I've had an easy life. I've still had struggles like a bout with depression, living for years below poverty lines, making really stupid and sinful choices, times of hating God, and a good number of brushes with death. And through all of it, God has blessed me with immeasurable riches and kindness even when I was dead through my trespasses (sin).

God brought people into my life who have changed me. God healed my depression. Random food would show up when we needed it. A couple bucks would appear to keep rent paid. And for all the terrible decisions I've made that should have derailed my life, if not killed me, I've gotten off really easy compared to most others.

Once again God's immeasurable riches poured onto me June 22<sup>nd</sup> when a bunch of strangers, including at least one atheist, showed up to my house to drop off over a hundred sandbags. I remember thinking, "I don't know a good chunk of these people, they don't owe me anything, I don't worship with the majority of them, why are they doing this?"

They did it because God has shown me immeasurable riches and kindness despite my being dead in my sin. Once again God has saved me as I currently stand back feeling guilty for all those homes that got flooded that needed it more than mine.

I don't know why God blesses me more than most others. I'll be honest: I don't like it or want it. I told my pastor that when I was a teen and she told me, "If God is blessing you abundantly, then use it to help others." I also understood her to be telling me to be grateful.

It has been my experience that God is the one who saves, rescues, and is kind. Not our jobs, not society, not insurance, not the government, not FEMA, not even friends and family. God uses all those things (and more), most of the time without them even knowing it, but they're not the source of immeasurable riches and kindness, they're just the object being used at the time.

With all that God has done for me I find I can't not love God. I can't not be Jesus' servant. I can't not worship and sacrifice my income to God because God has done so much for me and just keeps giving more all the time. God is relentless and is "not fair" in the opposite way.

I don't know why I've received immeasurable riches and kindness, other than I know it's vastly undeserved. But I do know that going out of your way to serve Jesus, to worship him, pray to him, sacrifice to him, even when it's difficult, always yields vastly more than you put in. Test it out and make it a point to actively listen and watch for God and I'm willing to bet you too will experience God's unfair immeasurable riches and kindness.






# BAKING COOKIES or BARS FOR JUDGING AT THE COUNTY FAIR?




# **Sewing for Graduating Seniors**

President John Shamp gave a review of the ELCA Synod Assembly. The review is also available in the Messenger.

President' Report given by John Shamp

- 1. Past flood- very grateful for the many members who served as volunteers.
- 2. The church was available for several Wellness Checks during the flood and recovery.
- 3. Youth happenings and those attending has grown and a thank you should be given to Tera Elness for doing an amazing job with our children and youth programing.
- 4. Financially as a congregation we are doing well, but need to find a way to increase monies. We thank those who have been willing to step forth and help ALC meet its financial responsibility.

Treasurer's Report given by Kevin Heggeseth

- 1. Our giving is up. Very grateful.
- 2. We have borrowed \$41,000.00 from ourselves as of today.
- 3. Expenses are also up; 72% of expenses are in budget staffing.
- a. \$30,000 of Tera Elness salary is paid out of the Trust Fund.
- 4. Property Insurance also went up and the increase was not expected. Increased \$11,000.
- 5. We pay bills 3 times a month.
- 6. Questions?
- a. Page Kern asked what the deductible on the property insurance is? Keith Pohlman, head of the Property Board could not recall, but that information would be given at a later date.


