Pastor's Message

2024

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth...

-The Apostles' Creed

We say the Apostles' Creed at just about every worship service. New members and parents having their kid baptized are asked to profess it and it is taught in confirmation from the Small Catechism. Yet, it's one of those things that I know I say without thinking about what I'm saying. I also realize that the language in there is fairly churchy and I wonder sometimes how many people in the pews actually know what we're saying and why.

A creed is what a person believes. The early Church came up with the Apostles' Creed so that Christians knew the basics of their faith. Basically, they crammed the main themes of the Bible into a short saying. Martin Luther found out in his time five hundred years ago that, even though families may have known the creed, they didn't actually know what it meant. He then wrote the Small Catechism to explain it so that families would be better able to understand what we believe.

The Small Catechism is worth everyone reading once a year. It's something you can read in a sitting. I have placed some at the back of the church. They're free. Take one. Read it. Read it out loud as a family.


What's great about the early Church creating this statement of beliefs is that when we make it foundational in our lives, when we know it and know what it means, it speaks to us in pretty much every situation we face. (For the record, the Bible does too and in a much better way, but the Creed condenses and simplifies the Bible. Please, read your Bibles and know scripture too, but if not, bare minimum, know the Small Catechism and the meanings).

It starts with reminding us God created everything. If you ever feel worthless, be reminded that God is awesome, loving, perfect, and that God created you. If you feel you're trapped with nowhere good to go, be reminded that if God can create everything from nothing, then God can create a new path for you to a better life.

The second part is about God becoming a human where we're taught that God knows exactly what it's like to have a parents, go through puberty, and the struggles of being twenty firsthand. We learn that even as God, even as a kind helper to everyone, that Jesus was lied about, falsely accused, and killed, telling us that even when we love and serve God and do everything right, evil may still happen to us. And we learn that that's never the end because we're told that God raised Jesus from the dead and put him in the most powerful position ever. We're basically being told that in time God rights wrongs and vindicates us when evil things happen to us. We're told Jesus is the final judge and everything will come to light, so we don't have to worry about what anyone says about us or does to us.

It ends by telling us that we are not alone. We are part of a catholic (all Christian denominations together) family that is to support one another. Our congregations help us by helping raise our kids (Sunday school), gives us wisdom from our elders, with the younger lending their strength to help the weaker. It's a place where we pray for each other, have shoulders to cry on, give and receive encouragement, etc. We commune, meaning we are all one body working together to serve Jesus to make the world better. We are always forgiven no matter what. We don't have to fear death because we'll rise again so we can live courageously and generously.

Take a catechism, learn the creed and what it means because it is a powerful tool and a powerful piece of a Christian's foundation for living.





Devotions and opening prayer were provided by Pastor Adam.

One correspondence note was shared from SWMN Synod.

The Secretary's Report for August was approved as printed. MM/S/C (Cory/ Nick)

The Treasurer's Report for August was approved as printed. MM/S/C (Cory/Keith)

Pastor Sarah and Pastor Adam's Reports were shared as printed. Pastor Sarah stated that the new fence around the parsonage sure has added a new look.

Old Business:

Dear friends and partners in mission,

September 2024

School has re-started after the summer break both here in Guyana and in the United States! On the Sunday before the first day of school in Guyana, Pastor Amanda Singh invited the children of Hope Lutheran Church, in the village of Ross, to receive words of encouragement and blessing as she laid her hands on each of their heads and prayed for them. The streets were buzzing with energy and excitement the next day as children reconnected with teachers, friends, and lessons. I pray that you have experienced similar blessings and energy in your congregations and towns at the start of the new school year.

It is not only children who have gone back to school in Guyana, but also adults, especially those identified as leaders by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana (ELCG). Fourteen of them have begun their studies in the Lutheran Lay Academy, which has re-opened after years of inactivity. Helping the ELCG to get the Lay Academy up and running, and establishing it on a firm footing so that it can continue is the main responsibility to which I have been called.

Students in the Lutheran Lay Academy choose one of three tracks to follow: They can prepare to be voluntary lay leaders in the church (a one-year track), deacons (an 18-month track), or pastors (a two-year track). There are two terms each year, and students take two courses per term. Right now, students of all three tracks are exploring Biblical Studies with Pastor Roy Thakurdyal, a Guyanese pastor serving a congregation in Canada, and Worship and Liturgy with Pastor Leroy Nicholson, who serves the Ebenezer parish of the ELCG. Pictured are the students in their Worship and Liturgy class.

Each course meets once a month online and once a month in person. The photo is of an in-person class, but as you can see, some of the students are online because the class meets simultaneously in two locations: at the church office in New Amsterdam (where I live), and at Calvary Lutheran Church in the capital city, Georgetown. Students attend class at whichever location is most convenient for them.

The students tell me that they are excited about learning new material and learning new ways of thinking about the familiar activities of reading the Bible and worshiping, although there are certainly challenges for them. Some have not been to school in a while, and they are running to catch up. Others are trying to balance their time between the work they do for a living and their coursework. Any of you who have gone back to school as adults can probably identify with those who face these challenges. The Lutheran Lay Academy Committee that oversees the program is considering ways that we can support the students better in handling these challenges successfully. It is a work in progress.

One thing we have done is set up a little library and study area in each of the locations where the classes meet. I use these resources myself whenever I have a sermon to prepare or a workshop to lead.

Many thanks to you for sharing our work in this way.
